History of Ancient Rome: Early Rome and Italy; History of the Roman Republic; Creation of the Roman Mediterranean Power; Crisis and Fall of the Roman Republic; Early Roman Empire; Crisis of Ancient Slave Society in the 3rd century AD; Late Roman Empire.
