"Economic theory" is an academic discipline that includes the following aspects: economic theory and economic practice; economic agents (market and nonmarket), property and economic management, economic interests, goals and means, economic rationality: choosing the best solution; competition and its types; economic goods and their classifications (including classification of resources), full and partial complementarity and interchangeability of goods, goods and money; the time factor and discounting, flows and stocks, nominal and real values; benefit and income cycles; costs and outcomes: total, marginal and average values; opportunity costs; economic constraints: the production possibilities frontier, society's trade-off between efficiency and equality, the individual's trade-off between consumption and leisure; short-term and long-term periods in economic analysis; comparative advantage.
