Summary of the academic discipline:

The academic discipline "Fundamentals of Psycholinguistics" is included in the module of general scientific and professional disciplines in the curriculum of the specialty "1-21 05 06 Romano-Germanic Philology".

The content structure of the discipline "Fundamentals of Psycholinguistics" has a complex character, including theoretical and experimental thematic blocks.
