<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Brief content of the academic discipline:</b></p> <p>The structure of the discipline "General psychology" is represented by 2 sections: "Introduction to the subject of psychology", "Mental cognitive processes". The first section - theoretical and methodological – considers the subject and objectives of psychology as a science, the specifics of the subject of psychology; the formation of psychology as an independent science, the structure of psychology, the basic categories of scientific psychology; the concept of the psyche and consciousness, phylogenesis and ontogenesis of the psyche and consciousness, mental phenomena, the brain and mental phenomena; methodology of the psychological concept. The second section is the concept, structure, specificity, functionality, mechanisms and patterns of mental cognitive processes: sensations, perception, attention, ideas, memory, imagination, thinking, speech, will.</p>
