**Summary of the academic discipline:**

Criminalistics is a science about the regularities of the mechanism of crime, the emergence of information about the crime and its participants, the regularities of collecting, researching, evaluating and using evidence and special means and methods of solving and investigating crimes based on the knowledge of these regularities.

Criminalistics develops forensic characteristics of crimes, tactical recommendations for rational and effective investigative and search actions during the investigation of crimes, conditions for the use of forensic tools and methods aimed at implementing the principle of legality in operational-search and investigative practice.

The content of the academic discipline is structured based on the traditional approach, which provides for four sections of forensic science: theoretical and methodological foundations of forensic science, forensic study of the material structure of a crime, forensic tactics and forensic methods.
